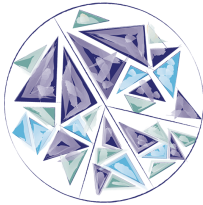

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# Database Books

“Books where a database of resources forms the central element (i.e., not as an enhancement to a text-based book) around which the book is formed. These can be non-linear, with multiple access points, or can incorporate updates or versioning, akin to a ‘living archive’. Considers the question when is something a digital archive, and when is it a publication, or a book?”

This workshop held on November 12, 2019 brought together fifty researchers, archival specialists, open data technologists, and government representatives to think about the intersection between open data technologies, digital humanities and research data practices in Kenya.

The event ran from 9:30 AM - 3:30 PM and was organized around an opening presentation by Angela Okune and Leonida Mutuku followed by three panel sessions which explored how diverse institutions have attempted to support student interests in research and archiving; raised questions about existing forms of scholarly knowledge outputs; and dove into the politics and geographies of data localisation and governance.

# “Database as Book” as Methodology?



- Assemble team of researchers who desire to collaborate (ideally who already have their own research portfolios and training, deep trust and relationships with each other, shared areas of overlapping interests)
- Develop documented shared expectations
- Development of overarching topical focus
- Co-design brainstorming session to tease out how each of our personal areas of interest tie into the broader topic
- Host gathering where members of publics are invited into the topic and give early-stage feedback (this is part of “peer review” of the book)
- Upload artifacts, annotate them to draw out shared analytic threads of interest
- Discuss regularly as author team; draw in external parties to also share and keep each other accountable
